### **Diaper Depot expands** into monthly program

What began in 2012, as a Leadership St. Joseph project to avail local parents to emergency supplies of diapers, has now transformed into a monthly supplemental diapers program.

In April 2023, Diaper Depot signed on with Happy Bottoms, a diaper bank in Kansas City. Through this partnership, parents in Buchanan, Andrew, DeKalb, Clinton counties in Missouri and Doniphan County in Kansas, are able to sign up to receive two-thirds of their diaper needs for the month free of charge. Diaper Depot also supplies a choice of wipes, ointment or powder with each pickup.

The goal of the program is to keep children, up to age four, healthier through increased diaper changes and to alleviate financial hardship for families.

A potty training kit is available, upon assessment, for children who are ready to transition out of diapers. Currently, there are approximately 100 children signed up to receive monthly diapers.

Eligible parents wishing to sign up for the program can visit the Diaper Depot section on helpmenow.org or scan the QR code to fill out their profile form on the HappyBottoms portal page. Enrollment in the program is free, but required. Parents need to bring identification for themselves (driv-

er's license or other ID) and for the child (birth certificate, medicaid card, etc.) for their first pickup. Weekly pickup days are Tuesdays 9 am - 1 pm and Wednesdays 1 - 5 pm each month; December diapers must be picked up in November, to avoid conflict with the Adopt-A-Family

program.



Callers reach a trained, caring Call Specialist who assesses the needs of each person and searches a database with more than 8,000 services to connect callers with the help they need.

> ♦ In 2023, the agency had 27,959 contacts, made 9,335 referrals, and advocated on behalf of 2,703 clients.

Anyone can now search the agency's database through Help Me Online by visiting www.helpmenow.org.

It's free. It's confidential. It's available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.



The Fab-U-Less Finds voucher program allows each household to receive six free items per person within the household, four times a year.

The store is open to the public and relies on donations for its inventory; the store offers pick ups for those donors who cannot deliver.

The voucher program served 2,310 people in 2023, providing 18,788 free items, including clothes, household, furniture and medical supplies.

✤ Of the 894 families that applied during the 2023 program, 342 households had \$0 income.

unduplicated contacts

The majority, 81 percent (726 families), are at 100 percent or below poverty guidelines; 15 percent (135 families) are up to 35 percent above poverty guidelines; and 3 percent (33 families) are 36 percent or more above poverty guidelines.

✤ In 2023, 745 different adopters provided

assistance to the families. This included, 214 individuals, families, businesses, and organizations. There were 531 undesignated monetary donations made to the program to help cover the cost of food baskets, gift cards and vouchers for families.

The agency uses emergency funds for the people that "fall through the cracks" like car payments, insurance, and repairs, phone bills, medical needs and other necessities required to exist. The agency tries to fill those gaps.





✤ In 2023, 40 individuals applied for glasses, with 16 receiving a pair.

Throughout the program's history nearly 2,750 people have applied for a pair of glasses critical for work, injury avoidance and optic health.
